ADMISSION TO THE 2023 MASTERS PROGRAMME IN COUNSELLING PSYCHOLOGY

Thank you for your request for information regarding Masters studies in our Department.

Please note that application to the MA Counselling Psychology degree is a dual-process. You will need to submit a general application to the University's Admissions office as well as an application to the University's Psychology Department. The documents required for each application is different. Please see below.

Admissions Application

Applicants are requested to use the online application system - please visit the following website <https://www.mandela.ac.za/Study-at-Mandela/Application>.

Documents required:

- Certified copy of your ID
- Certified copy of matric certificate/school leaving results
- Certified copies of your Honours/Undergraduate degree certificate(s)
- Academic record(s) and certificate(s) of conduct from previous institutions (with English translations where required)
- Certified copy of marriage certificate (where applicable)
- SAQA certificate for qualifications obtained at a non-South-African institute (where applicable)

Department of Psychology Application (All documents to be mailed to macounspsychapp@mandela.ac.za)

- Referee reports (to be emailed by referee directly to macounspsychapp@mandela.ac.za)
- U24 (SP5)
- Autobiography information

Please ensure you have all documents ready to upload before starting this process.

Referee Reports:

Please ask 3 people of your choice to act as referees. Two of these should preferably be senior academic staff from a Department of Psychology. If this is not possible, consider using alternative sources for referees such as clinical supervisors that you have worked for on community projects. Friends, family and fellow students are not acceptable as referees. We request that the referees return the completed forms directly to macounspychapp@mandela.ac.za by the application closing date, which is **31 May 2022**. **Please note that the completion of these referee reports is VERY IMPORTANT.**

NO LATE OR INCOMPLETE APPLICATIONS WILL BE CONSIDERED.

Your application for admission to the Masters programme will only be considered once all documents for both application processes (Admissions application and Psychology Department application) have been submitted.

Applicants who qualify for the short list will be eligible to take part in the selection programme which will take place at a later date during 2022. The Department will notify you whether you have been successful or not. Please note that **no personal feedback concerning the process or outcome will be given to applicants.**

General application guidelines

The financial cost involved in studying towards a Master's degree is considerable. Therefore, we would like to be of assistance to you in your application for a post-graduate bursary.
